The Whistlebinkies

The Whistlebinkies started out in Glasgow over 50 years ago: it is difficult to say exactly when, as it meandered into existence over a number of stages before it emerged from its chrysalis. There still were ships being built on the Clyde, coal being mined and steel being forged, the city had not yet been defaced by motorways and the wrecker's ball.

Out of the shipyards had come one Billy Connolly and his pal, the late Mick Broderick, the story-teller, batterer of the Bhodran and the founder who came up with the name The Whistlebinkies. Graduating from the Scotia Bar the band, sharpening its focus, were among the earliest ensembles to combine the Celtic harp, fiddle and bellows-blown pipes. Over the years they have accumulated a vast performing collection of tunes, many ancient but some brand new. They have graced venues the world over and, encouraged in its syncretic approach by flautist-composer Eddie McGuire, explored new territory in combining with orchestras and exploring multimedia formats.

But at the heart of everything are the tunes, about places, about people, about journeys, lovers, battles and the Loch-Ness monster.

As the late John Cage said of the Whistlebinkies: "They are just lovely!"
